SETTING THE TABLE

Can you think of a time when you've had to trust someone, or something? What did that feel like?

In today's Bible reading, Jesus on the cross responds with words of incredible trust. These are not random words that Jesus thinks of. This is a direct quote from Psalm 35.

As you hear the story, what do you imagine Jesus felt?

WORD OF GOD, WORD OF LIFE ~ LUKE 23:44-46

It was now about noon, and darkness came over the whole land until three in the afternoon, for the sun stopped shining. And the curtain of the temple was torn in two. Then Jesus, crying with a loud voice, said, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit." Having said this, he breathed his last.

Pause your playback device and take a few quiet moments to let the Word of God sink in. Let the Spirit draw your attention to certain words, images, thoughts, and feelings.

Pause your playback device and try one of the following exercises today.

(You can give others a try in the days to come if you have time and interest.)

1. Take a few moments to reflect on the following questions:
 - Can you tell a story of a time you've been at a loss for words?
 - Can you find a Psalm that communicates the sadness, anger, helplessness, wonder or joy to fit your situation?

Write your thoughts down, or share them with a friend or members of your family.

2. Earlier we reflected on Jesus saying words from Psalm 22. Today we hear him saying words from Psalm 35. Take a few moments with your family or a friend to discuss this question: "Why do you think Jesus keeps going back to the Psalms— keeps using words that aren't his own from the cross?"
3. Consider these questions:
 - When things around you are hard, or sad, what helps you get through?
 - How might Jesus' words from the cross, difficult as they are, also give us hope?
4. In the past 7 weeks we have considered the Jesus' last words before his death on the cross. Which stands out to you most? Is it the time of thirst? Is it the admitting of being forsaken? Is it the trust of the last words in Luke? Or one of the others?
How might one of those sayings be God's invitation to become a more fully alive human? Follow through on what the Spirit stirs in your mind and soul.
