### SETTING THE TABLE

Take a look at your hands...

- Notice the creases in the skin of your skin.
- Feel the callouses on your fingers.
- Rub the nicks and scars on your knuckles.
- Note the dirt under your nails.
- Trace the veins on the back of your hand.
- Are there birthmarks? Rings? Tattoos?

Now make the shape of a fist. Hold it tight. Then release your clenched muscles and hold your hands flat, palms upward. What have your hands received today? Who have your hands touched today?

Today's Bible reading prods us to pay attention to what—or better yet, who—is in front of us right here, right now. As you watch and listen to what Jesus does and says, imagine what people do (or don't do) with their hands...

Word of God, Word of Life ~ John 19:25-27

Near the cross of Jesus stood his mother, his mother's sister, Mary the wife of Clopas, and Mary Magdalene. When Jesus saw his mother there, and the disciple whom he loved standing nearby, he said to her, "Woman, here is your son," and to the disciple, "Here is your mother." From that time on, this disciple took her into his home.

Pause your playback device and take a few quiet moments to let the Word of God sink in. Let the Spirit draw your attention to certain words, images, thoughts, and feelings.

RESPONDING TO THE WORD

~ HERE ~

"Jesus said to her, 'Here is your son,' and to the disciple, 'Here is your mother.'"

(John 19:26-27)

Pause your playback device and try one of the following exercises today.

(You can give some or all of the others a try in the days to come if you have time and interest.)

- 1. Take a few moments with your family or a friend to discuss these questions:
  - The disciple took Mary into his home. What do you think that actually looked like?
  - What sorts of emotions and feelings do you think Mary and the disciple experienced together?
- 2. Jesus gave his mother to the disciple and vice versa. Who has been a gift to you? What did that person do that proved to be good for you? Take some time to write those stories of down, or tell them to a friend or family member.
- 3. When Jesus directed his mother and his friend to look toward each other, he was instructing them, "this is where your attention should go." Take a few quiet moments to listen to Jesus: where is he turning your attention? To whom does he want you to look? Act on what emerges.
- 4. Use the "5 Finger Prayer" (below) to pray for others.

# **5 Finger Prayer**

### **Thumb**

Pray for those closest to you—your friends and family.

# **Index**

Pray for those who point you in the right direction: teachers, doctors, coaches, people in your church, and so on.

# Tallest (middle)

Pray for people who are in charge of things that are bigger and often beyond our control, such as politicians.

# Ring (the weakest)

Pray for those who are in trouble, or in pain.

### **Pinkie**

Pray for yourself and your own needs.

Begin by giving thanks.

For each finger and thumb, name someone who has been good to you. Then pray for the following: How do you need help from others? What might you need from God to equip you in loving someone well?



#### SONG FOR THE DAY ~ Kindness
